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Organization and Functions

MISSION AND MAJOR FUNCTIONS OF THE  
U.S. ARMY FIELD SUPPORT COMMAND (FSC)

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Applicability. This regulation applies to the U.S. Army Field Support Command, a subordinate installation of the U.S. Army Operations Support Command (OSC).

Decentralized Printing. All OSC installations may locally reproduce this regulation.

Supplementation. Supplementation of this regulation and establishment of local forms requires prior approval from the proponent.

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1. Purpose. This regulation sets forth the mission and major functions of the FSC and its subordinate elements. This regulation assigns responsibility and delegates authority to the Commanding General for the accomplishment of assigned missions.

2. Mission.

a. Maintain the readiness and accountability of the Army's war reserve combat, combat support, combat service support equipment and materiel globally prepositioned; this includes prepositioned sets, operational project stocks and sustainment stocks.

b. Issue Army Prepositioned Stocks (APS) equipment and materiel, when and where required, in support of the Army's global power projection mission.

c. Reconstitute APS upon completion of operations.

d. Serve as the program manager for the Logistics Assistance Program (LAP) providing a centralized point for the worldwide collection and exchange of logistics and readiness intelligence.

e. Serve as the U.S. Army Materiel Command (AMC) Executive Agent for the Logistics Support Element (LSE) program. Facilitate development of integrated applications of AMC's strategic level technical capabilities for synchronized projection during contingencies.

f. Serve as the Program Manager for Logistics Civil Augmentation Program (LOGCAP).

g. Represent the Commander, AMC, as the single manager for integration of all force modernization, readiness and sustainment actions into a single effort to enhance and support the peacetime mission and war fighting capability of the U.S. Army worldwide.

3. Major Functions.

a. Serve as AMC's responsible agent for planning, managing and executing the APS missions worldwide.

b. Establish procedures and execute the receipt, storage, care of supplies in storage (COSIS), loan, issue, inspection, maintenance and reconstitution of APS materiel on land and afloat.

c. Develop and manage program and resource requirements, allocations, and execution in support of APS mission.

d. Implement/maintain the Department of the Army (DA)/AMC policy guidance and accountability for APS materiel worldwide.

e. Establish, formulate and coordinate long-range APS strategic operations planning, and procedures in support of the worldwide APS mission to incorporate power projection and global prepositioning strategies.

f. Plan, execute, coordinate and evaluate reserve component support and overseas deployment training at various APS global missions.

g. Develop necessary plans to maintain/transition accountability of APS assets, providing total asset visibility through input to Army standard automation systems.

h. Maintain accountable records for all materiel via the Standard Army Management Information System(s) (STAMIS).

i. Provide facilities, personnel and equipment to accomplish the APS missions of storage, issue, port handling, transportation, maintenance, COSIS, demilitarization and security.

j. Coordinate with National Inventory Control Points, Service Item Control Centers, and U.S. Army Medical Materiel Agency to fill shortages, acquire replacement materiel and obtain disposition instructions for excess/unserviceable stocks.

k. Maintain the supply posture profile for all APS assets within the ownership of the FSC.

l. Conduct new materiel fielding planning into APS sets through coordination with weapon system proponents throughout DA.

m. Review and validate unit status reporting of APS readiness in accordance with (IAW) Army Regulation (AR) 220-1. Coordinate get-well plans for equipment serviceability. Establish/implement/execute fill of all shortages to approved modification table of organization and equipment (MTOE) and operational projects/sustainment/ authorized stockage list (ASL)/prescribed load list (PLL) authorizations.

n. Integrate/track/report modification work order (MWO) programs for the FSC. Maintain applicable MWOs for APS and ensure their application.

o. Coordinate with DA/AMC for the release of APS to support contingency operations to include receipt, configuration, preservation, storage, maintenance, issue, loan and reconstitute.

p. Plan and execute the redistribution of APS.

q. Perform maintenance on prepositioned equipment based on Technical Manual (TM) 10 and 20-series Preventive Maintenance Checks and Services (PMCS) IAW AR 750-1 to include maintaining records IAW DA Pamphlet (PAM) 738-750 and preservation and processing for storage IAW TM 38-470.

r. Direct Government and contractor-performed functions to accomplish overall APS mission.

s. Develop detailed issue/loan and reconstruction plans for exercises and contingencies in which the war fighter uses APS equipment.

t. Plan and develop operational orders for redistribution, loan, or issuance of APS equipment.

u. Based on readiness impacts, plan/direct/execute annual APS maintenance workload.

v. Develop necessary statements of work for contractor operations, including LOGCAP, in support of the APS mission and table of distribution and allowances (TDA) changes with AMC/DA/U.S. Army Force Modernization Support Activity.

w. Coordinate with DA/AMC and other proponents on operational projects equipment authorizations.

x. Report/track all equipment on temporary loan from APS records.

y. Coordinate necessary Modified Table of Organization and Equipment (MTOE) changes with AMC/DA/U.S. Army Force Modernization Support Activity.

z. Coordinate/direct the movement of equipment to satisfy equipment shortages across all elements of APS.

aa. Lobby DA to ensure adequate placement of APS units in the Department of Army Placement List (DAMPL) in order to provide the warfighter with force modernized equipment.

ab. Plan and execute overall logistics operations to include maintenance, transload, load plan, and coordination with Military Sealift Command (MSC)/Military Traffic Management Command (MTMC) operations in support of AMC-Afloat (APS-3) prepositioned program.

ac. Perform all levels of maintenance to include depot level rebuild, on U.S. Army watercraft, associated equipment and materiel handling equipment in support of the prepositioned afloat program.

ad. Receive, inspect, classify, store, maintain, inventory, issue and rotate watercraft, equipment and stocks in support of the prepositioned afloat program.

ae. Plan and direct the APS-3 ship transloads.

af. Plan, coordinate and direct all mission and functional activities required to manage the worldwide LAP.

ag. Provide staff management; establish, coordinate and implement policy and perform program management duties for the DA LAP and serves as the DA Executive Agent for AR 700-4.

ah. Justify and defend worldwide requirements essential to the operation of the LAP.

ai. Coordinate/facilitate worldwide LAP structure in concert with Army restructure initiatives.

aj. Serve as the AMC Executive Agent for AMCR 700-19, LAP Mobility Program, and AMCR 500-4, LAP Mobilization Contingency/ Humanitarian Relief and Exercise Planning and Management.

ak. Serve as program manager for the LSE Program.

al. Execute program manager contingency functions in response to the deployed LSE during all exercises and contingencies.

am. Maintain the contingency LSE TDA.

an. Validate LSE personnel requirements for deployments and forwards to AMC for fill.

ao. Promote the integration of reserve component military personnel into the LSE program, both in peace and for deployment during contingencies.

ap. Develop and maintain LSE Commander and planner guides, LSE Planning Model and other documents facilitating transition of LSE deliberate plans to crisis action plans.

aq. Serve as the HQ AMC Command focal point in outside the continental United States (OCONUS) theater areas of operation for: notification of serious incidents; transmittal or reception of information during implementation of all emergency plans; deployment issues/actions; and materiel weaknesses.

ar. Serve as focal point for the development of emerging doctrine and inclusion in FM 63-11, LSE tactics, techniques and procedures.

as. Direct overall policy, planning and assignment of tasks over all assigned AMC LSE organizational elements/personnel located in the European and Pacific theaters when and where necessary to ensure a unified direction in support of the theater.

at. Develop overall planning policy and methodology and subsequently disseminate to AMC Forwards to ensure a unified direction in support of the theater.

au. Serve as the central emergency, contingency and contingency planning element for all assigned AMC LSE organizations in the European and Pacific theaters. (Command and control relationships upon mobilization are subject to conditions stated in the applicable LSE Transition-to-War Plans).

av. IAW AR 700-142 and DA PAM 700-142, establish and operate OCONUS staging sites in the Republic of Korea and Germany for the fielding of new equipment and MWOs.

aw. Oversee, monitor and coordinate the force modernization, equipment modification, data collection for AMC equipment and maintenance improvement programs for activities in supported units.

ax. Serve as the AMC European, Southwest Asian and Pacific integrated logistics coordinator for all weapon system fielding and product improvement programs scheduling for the U.S. European Command, Eighth U.S. Army (EUSA), and U.S. Army Pacific (USARPAC), U.S. Central Command (CENTCOM). Retain cognizance of issues that may impact supported units.

ay. Provide assistance to continental United States (CONUS) and OCONUS theater commanders at all levels in resolving logistics problems.

az. Develop, review, coordinate and monitor memorandums of understanding between AMC and major component elements in theater, in coordination with AMC, U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command (TRADOC), U.S. Army Special Operations Command (USASOC), and U.S. Central Command (CENTCOM); EUSA and USARPAC; and other component commands as applicable. Provide staff assistance in development of support agreements processing under the Memorandum of Understanding; negotiate support agreements for individual and agency logistical support of AMC elements in, or projected for, the CONUS and OCONUS theaters during peacetime; and maintains a repository of signed agreements.

ba. Serve as the AMC integrated logistics coordinator for all weapon system fielding and product improvement programs scheduled for TRADOC, USASOC, USARPAC, USAREUR and CENTCOM. Identify issues that impact on individual weapon system fielding and identify systemic trends in the materiel fielding and identify systemic trends in the materiel fielding process.

bb. Determine the total Pacific, Southwest Asia and European facility requirements for AMC elements.

bc. Perform overflow integrated general support and management of depot-level maintenance contracts within Korean industry, including the completion of technical data packages and statement of work; performs technical assistance on request; contracting officer's representative's responsibilities; forecast workloads; and monitor contractor's overall performance.

bd. Operate materiel staging and fielding sites to consolidate and ensure complete systems; e.g., end items, authorized stockage list, prescribed load list, special tools, test equipment, additional support items of equipment, and technical manuals are handed off to units receiving new force modernization equipment.

be. Act, where appropriate, as an OCONUS central point of contact in-country for execution of the AMC Warranty Program and assisting in the resolution of warranty-related problems during peacetime only.

bf. Serve as agent for AMC major subordinate commands (MSCs) to interface/ coordinate letters of notification, MWO fielding plan, and MWOs in the Republic of Korea, Southwest Asia, and the European Theater Area of Operations. Negotiate location and schedule for application of MWO. Receive other supporting commands.

bg. Coordinate Reserve Components support of AMC LSE and LOGCAP.

bh. Participate in exercise design, play, data collection, and remedial actions; staff the AMC C-LOC, as required; brief the logistics battlefield during exercises and events.

bi. Coordinate with the Army doctrine proponent; review and coordinate doctrine publications; ensure that doctrine reflects the role of the Command in force projection logistics; assist Army schools to integrate the Command's mission into training programs; and provide information to doctrine proponenty regarding deployment and employment of DOD civilians and contractors during contingencies.

bj. Maintain cognizance of logistics concepts for the future such as Focused Logistics, Army After Next, Revolution in Military Logistics (RML), Army Transformation, etc. and apprise AMC Forwards of impact on LSE concepts of operation and force structure.

bk. Advise system developers of LOGCAP requirements and monitor development of Joint and Army Command, control and planning systems; develop plans for the systems.

bl. Provide technical advice regarding automation support of LOGCAP and the LSEs.

bm. Participate in North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) Security Investment Program to represent AMC interests for applicable European facilities to include development of capability packages, project development, joint initial and final acceptance inspections, annual maintenance inspections and environmental requirements. To provide credible project information to secure NATO Common funding of U.S. Power Projection

Infrastructure. Maintain liaison with U.S. Army Europe NATO Office and Host Nation Points of Contact in support of this program.

bn. Maintain, renovate, and repair facilities in support of the accomplishment of the FSC mission.

bo. Manage LOGCAP as the Executive Agent for DA. Provide oversight of the AMC LOGCAP Umbrella Contract.

bp. Manage the availability, utilization and deployment of the force provider modules.

bq. Conduct annual requirements conference with Army Service Component Commands, Theater Army Area Commands or Theater Support Commands and other customers of LOGCAP.

br. Prioritize LOGCAP planning requirements and direct contractor planning; review contractor worldwide, regional, and country specific plans.

bs. Ensure LOGCAP is integrated into warfighting combatant Commands and their Army Service Component Command's Operation Plan; ensure that Government furnished materiel and services are either planned for or in-place; and ensure that the Government has procedures for evaluating contractor plans and performance during exercises and events.

bt. Develop and maintain memorandums of agreement with U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Defense Contract Management Agency and other supporting commands.

bu. Determine budget requirements for fill of Army Working Capital Fund funded APS-PS shortages and maintain oversight of AMC Integrated Materiel Management Center budget requirements for filling APS-PS, ASL/PLL, APS-OP, and APS-S shortages.

4. Relationships. The FSC is under the Command jurisdiction of the Commanding General, OSC. The OSC Commanding General, assigns the Commanding General FSC, responsibility and authority to exercise Command jurisdiction over the Command and its subordinates IAW the missions assigned. FSC, its subordinates, tenants, and other Government services/activities provide and receive administrative and logistical support IAW negotiated agreements.

5. Materiel Assignments.

a. The FSC is the DA/AMC responsible agent of APS, Army Prepositioned Stock-Sustainment, and Army Prepositioned Stock-Operational Projects. The FSC is responsible for planning, organizing, directing, coordinating and controlling multiple functions relating to maintenance and readiness of these stocks.

b. Sets, kits, outfits; special tools; tool sets; and test, measurement, and diagnostic equipment which are part of, or used with assigned items.

c. Other equipment/materiel assigned.
