Organization and Functions

MISSION AND MAJOR FUNCTIONS OF THE U.S. ARMY OPERATIONS
SUPPORT COMMAND (OSC) ACTIVE ARMY AMMUNITION PLANTS (AAPs)

Applicability. This regulation applies to the active AAPs subordinate to the OSC.

Decentralized printing. All OSC installations may locally reproduce this regulation.

Supplementation. Supplementation of this regulation and establishment of local forms requires prior approval from the proponent.

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1. Purpose. This regulation sets forth the mission and major functions of each OSC active Government-owned, contractor-operated (GOCO) AAP.

2. General.

a. The OSC GOCO AAPs are military installations/activities under the jurisdiction of the OSC Commanding General (CG).

b. The Commander of an AAP:

(1) Is assigned responsibility and delegated authority to exercise command jurisdiction over the installation.

(2) Is responsible for performing, or requiring performance for contract administration as a contracting officer's representative and/or administrative contracting officer.

(3) Has full and ultimate authority for safety, security, and environmental protection of the installation which means the Commander is responsible and has the full-line authority of the OSC CG to terminate or require specific measures be taken, as he or she deems appropriate, for any and all activities and operations planned or in progress on the installation, including operations on behalf of the Government when the Command assigns the workload or whether the operation is under third-party contract.

(4) Is entitled to the full functional support of OSC, and the Government technical organizations of the Department of Defense in carrying out his/her duties.

(5) Has the full-line authority of the OSC CG, in calling on the support of Government technical organizations in making independent Government assessments, judgments, and decisions related to safety, security and environmental impact.

c. Responsibilities and authorities delegated to Department of the Army civilians and exercised by the assigned Commander's representative.

3. Mission-General. The AAP may perform the following mission assignments under contract operation:

a. Operation and maintenance of active facilities in support of current operations. Maintenance and/or layaway of stand-by facilities (including machinery and package lines received from industry or other Government installations) in condition to permit rehabilitation and resumption of production within the prescribed time limitations.

b. Receipt, surveillance, maintenance, renovation, storage, physical inventory, issue, demilitarization and salvage of field serviced stocks, items of industrial stocks and international logistics requirements stocks.

c. Procurement, receipt, storage and issue of necessary supplies, equipment, components and essential materials.

d. Industrial readiness planning, master planning and emergency mobilization planning, including preparation, review and revision of prescribed plans.

e. Product assurance functions in support of procurement and production.

f. Production engineering and process engineering.

g. Support services to tenants.

h. Custodial maintenance and administrative functions of sub-installations.

i. Provide support to and surveillance of Modernization and Expansion Program.

j. Monitor third-party contract efforts performed IAW the Plant Utilization Policy.

k. Provide a fire prevention and protection program in compliance with applicable regulations and contract requirements.

l. Provide and promote an energy conservation program.

m. Properly manage an environmental program to keep installation in compliance with all Federal, state, and local environmental laws, regulations and rules.

4. Mission-Individual. OSC makes the following assignments in addition to the general admission assignment made in paragraph 3:

- a. Holston AAP, Kingsport, TN 37660-9982.
 - (1) Manufacture explosive and chemical materials.
 - (2) Handle and store strategic and critical materials for other Government agencies.
 - (3) Handle and store bulk explosives.
 - (4) Perform QASAS/storage surveillance functions.
- b. Iowa AAP, Middletown, IA 52638-5000.
 - (1) Load, assemble and pack (LAP) ammunition items.
 - (2) Perform special mission assignments.
 - (3) Maintain the capability to receive/ship containerized cargo.
 - (4) Perform Quality Assurance Specialist, Ammunition Surveillance (QASAS)/storage surveillance functions.
- c. Lake City AAP, Independence, MO 64051-0330.
 - (1) Manufacture small arms ammunition and associated explosive/ pyrotechnic materials.
 - (2) Proof test small arms ammunition.
 - (3) Perform certification inspection of small arms ammunition inspection equipment in support of small caliber ammunition procurement and production mission. Provide special test and measurement services to monitor activities of the contractor's calibration system for the quality assurance function.
 - (4) Coordinate, support and assist in the development, installation and test and evaluation of prototype production equipment in support of small caliber ammunition programs.
 - (5) Maintain the capability to receive/ship containerized cargo.
 - (6) Perform QASAS/storage surveillance functions, to include support of Sunflower AAP.

d. Lone Star AAP (contiguous to Red River Army Depot),
Texarkana, TX 75505-9101.

(1) Load, assemble and pack (LAP) ammunition items.

(2) Maintain the capability to receive/ship containerized cargo.

(3) Perform QASAS/storage surveillance functions.

e. Milan AAP, Milan, TN 38358-3176.

(1) Load, assemble and pack ammunition items.

(2) Maintain the capability to receive/ship containerized cargo.

(3) Handle and store ammunition as directed.

(4) Provide QASAS/storage surveillance functions.

f. Radford AAP, Radford, VA 24141-0099.

(1) Manufacture propellants, explosives, and chemical materials.

(2) Provide QASAS/storage surveillance functions.
