Colonel Scott J. Lofreddo Chief of Staff

Colonel Scott J. Lofreddo assumed the Army Sustainment Command Chief of Staff position on 25 June 2012. As Chief of Staff, COL Lofreddo leads a global organization responsible for sustaining Army and Joint Forces in the US and abroad in support of combatant commanders. COL Lofreddo was born in Oscoda, Michigan and enlisted in the United States Army as a Military Policeman in 1984.

Commissioned in 1987, COL Lofreddo graduated with a Bachelors degree in History from The University of South Florida. After attending the Infantry Officers' Basic Course, U.S. Army Ranger School and the U.S. Army Jumpmaster School in 1987, COL Lofreddo was assigned to Fort Bragg, North Carolina where he served as a Rifle and Anti-Tank Platoon Leader with the 325th Airborne Infantry Regiment, 82d Airborne Division. As a member of the Division he deployed to Saudi Arabia and Iraq during Operations Desert Shield/Storm from August 1990 until April 1991. Upon his return to Fort Bragg, COL Lofreddo was assigned as the Assistant Division Transportation Officer, 82d Airborne Division. Upon completion of the Transportation Officer Advanced Course and the Strategic Deployment Course, COL Lofreddo was assigned to the 13th Corps Support Battalion, Fort Benning, Georgia as the Battalion Logistics Officer and the Battalion Operations Officer and deployed with the unit to Somalia between August and December 1993. After redeploying to Fort Benning, COL Lofreddo assumed command of the 598th Maintenance Company (DS), where he received the 1994 General Douglas McArthur Leadership Award.

In 1995, COL Lofreddo was reassigned to the 75th Ranger Regiment, serving as the Regimental Transportation Officer and was named the Special Operations Command Transportation Officer of the Year for 1996. In 1997, COL Lofreddo participated in the U.S. Army's Training with Industry program at CSX Transportation in Jacksonville, Florida. Following his assignment with CSX Transportation he was assigned to the 524th Corps Support Battalion, Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, as the Support Operations Officer and Battalion Executive Officer. COL Lofreddo served as Aide to the Commanding General, United States Transportation Command and Air Mobility Command and Chief of Staff of the 1st Sustainment Command (Theater) before commanding the 80th Ordnance Battalion and 593rd Sustainment Brigade at Fort Lewis, Washington.

COL Lofreddo is a graduate of both the Army Command and General Staff College and the Naval War College earning Masters Degrees in Military Arts and Science as well as National Security and Strategic Studies.

His awards and decorations include: the Legion of Merit, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, the Meritorious Service Medal with (3 OLC), Army Commendation Medal (1 OLC), the Army Achievement Medal (6 OLC); the Joint Meritorious Unit Award, the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal the National Defense Service Medal with Bronze Star; United Nations Service Medal, Southwest Asia Service Medal (2 campaign stars), the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, the Overseas Service Ribbon, the Reserve Components Overseas Service Ribbon and the Kuwait Liberation Medals. His badges include the Ranger Tab, Expert Infantryman's Badge, Senior Parachutist Badge, and Honduran Parachutist Badge.
